By advocating for watercolor painting and serving as an advertisement for Watercolor USA, the video of *Watercolor Now I!* was directed to motivate artists to submit paintings to Watercolor USA.

Important Events:

1. Watercolor USA 2018 was held at the Springfield Art Museum from June 2 – August 26, 2018. Juror Kelly Kane, Editor-in-Chief of PleinAir Magazine, accepted 82 entries from 81 artists for exhibition. She awarded one Museum Purchase Award, and 5 Cash awards in the amounts of \$3,000, \$2,000, \$1,500, and \$1,000 in the exhibition. WHS Jurors Karla Breeding Trammell and Jerry Ellis awarded 10 WHS \$300 combination memorial and Award of Excellence cash awards, one National Watercolor Society \$500 Cash award, and 3 \$500 merchandise awards from Daniel Smith- watercolors, Escoda – brushes, and Savoir-Faire – Fabriano Paper.

2. WHS Lifetime Achievement Awards were presented to Dean Mitchell and Donald K. Lake, who also gave keynote speeches along with visual presentations of their work at a WHS dinner on Friday night following the opening of Watercolor USA .

3. Watercolor Now! 2019 was held at the Margaret Harwell Museum in Poplar Bluff, Missouri from October 6-November 24, 2018, consisting of 62 entries from WHS members. The Watercolor Now! committee consisted of Bob Mejer, chairperson, Wayne Conyers, Chris Buth Furness and Sandra Schaffer. Museum Director, Steve Whitworth, was extremely helpful in organizing the exhibition. WHS member Judi Betts generously provided \$500 towards the

creation of the Watercolor Now! catalog, which was both designed and produced through the efforts of Bob Mejer.

4. The WHS Board approved updated WHS Bylaws. The Bylaws Committee consisted of Sandra Schaffer, Laurin McCracken and Carole Hennessy. The new, updated Bylaws were approved by the total WHS membership through e-mail ballot.

5. The position of Workshop Chair was added to our bylaws. The board decided workshops would be held at the Springfield Art Museum using well known/popular artists and that monies generated could be used to provide larger awards for annual Watercolor USA exhibitions, thus benefitting both the museum and WHS. It was proposed that beginning in 2019 at least 2 workshops be held, with the assistance of Workshop Chair Rachel Woods and board member Karla Breeding Trammell.

6. WHS voted to ask our webmaster to set up PayPal on the WHS website to expedite and streamline dues payment for members. PayPal was set up in late December, along with a special page for dues payment on the website. The Pay by Check option remains if members decide they would rather pay in this way, and information on this option remains on the website.

7. The Board agreed that in the future the WHS Newsletter would include articles that take on controversial issues, as well as new products and methods being developed which impact our profession.

8. The Board suggested the following names of future Watercolor USA jurors to present to the Springfield Art Museum: Bob Mejer, Bruce Hartman, Stephen Quiller, Eric Weigardt. Soon Y. Warren, Dean Mitchell and Tom Schaller.

9. A new category of board member was established: Board Member Emeritus. This category would include board members who have contributed greatly to WHS over the years, and would be an honorary position, with no voting rights. However, we would look to these board members for advice and expertise. Those chosen this year for that position are: Jerry Berger and Judi Betts.

Due to problems with publicity and museum outreach, the workshop was rescheduled until the first part of November. This workshop was also canceled due to problems with publicity and outreach by the museum.**

Carole Hennessy and Laurin McCracken met with Nick Nelson at the Springfield Art Museum on July 10, 2019 to discuss the future of museum's relationship with WHS, and with the hope of coming to an understanding of the museum's intent in hosting future Watercolor Now! exhibitions, as well as holding and publicizing WHS workshops.**

- 1. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, Watercolor USA 2020 was juried by both the Museum's Juror, Misa Jeffereis, Assistant Curator, Contemporary Art Museum St. Louis, and WHS jurors of WHS Awards Carole Hennessy and Sandra Schaffer using digital images provided by the Museum. Also, due to the virus there was no opening reception for the show. All events at the Springfield Art Museum were canceled through October 14, 2020. However, the Watercolor USA Exhibition was hung at the Springfield Art Museum, and later in the summer visitors were able to view the show with special provisions for distancing and masks. The Museum produced a virtual exhibition of Watercolor USA 2020 in order that the show could be seen by those not visiting. The virtual exhibition was posted both on the Museum's website and the WHS website.**
- 2. Due to COVID-19, the WHS June 6, 2020 Board meeting was held via Zoom by Laurin McCracken and Carole Hennessy. New board members Lisa Englander, John Fitzgibbon and John Keeling, as WHS Treasurer, were welcomed to the board. Chalen Phillips resignation as WHS Treasurer had been previously accepted.**
- 3. A proposal was made at the June board meeting to hold an on-line Watercolor Now! in alternate years. This was further discussed at the September 26, 2020 Zoom meeting, hosted by President, Carole Hennessy, with the viability of this option to be investigated by Norma Herring and the Watercolor Now! Committee and brought up again during the January 16, 2021 scheduled Zoom board meeting.**
- 4. The schedules for Watercolor Now! 2021 and Watercolor Now! 2022 were laid out at the June Zoom board meeting. Watercolor Now! 2021 would be held at the Margaret Harwell Art Museum from December 5, 2020 through January 24, 2021. WHS will fund**

- 5. 5 \$300 Awards of Excellence in this exhibition, and the Harwell will fund a 6th Award of Excellence. This will be the first occasion for awards to be presented in a Watercolor Now!, with awards being funded by WHS on a trial basis with no commitment to present awards in future Watercolor Now! Exhibitions. Watercolor Now! 2022 will be held at the Birger Sandzen Memorial Art Gallery in Lindsborg, Kansas from August 21, 2022 – October 23, 2022.**
- 6. Watercolor Now! 2020 was successfully hung at the Margaret Harwell Art Museum on December 5, 2020. Bob Mejer worked hard as Watercolor Now! Committee Chair to gather, and in many cases help artists present their digital images in a usable format, as well as to create both the Watercolor Now! 2020 color catalog for participants, and a Power point presentation of all the works in the show. There were 61 entries in the show, with one entry not sent. Wayne Conyers did an excellent job of communicating with the museum director, Steve Whitworth, in helping to organize the show and in getting updated accounts of how it was progressing. Despite COVID-19, the show was able to be hung and appreciated by visitors for the surrounding areas, both during the reception and afterwards.**
- 7. WHS member artists Marilyn Bradley and Cheng-Khee Chee were chosen by the WHS board to be the recipients of our 2021 WHS Lifetime Achievement Awards at the September WHS Zoom board meeting.**
